St. Helen School Discipline Procedures, Rubrics and Consequences

At St. Helen School, we believe that building connections with students and families is the best way to be proactive with managing student behavior. Teachers and staff manage and process behavior incidents as they occur, in the context in which they occur, immediately. However, there are occasions when it is necessary to assign specific consequences.
